
Be Strong, Be Gentle, Be Beautiful

She is judo history's highest ranking woman and the last living student of Jigoro Kano, judo's founder.



97 year-old living legend, Keiko Fukuda (Kodokan 9th dan) lives her life by these words, her motto. These words are also the title of the documentary film about her inspirational life. We have finished filming and now the challenge is to raise the finishing funds, as we edit the film.
