RANK REQUIREMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

PROMOTION PROCEDURES

Yudanshakai Promotions

Each member Yudanshakai is given promotional authority to a particular rank, depending upon the length of time as a Yudanshakai, and the number and rank of Yudansha. Each Yudanshakai shall establish its own procedures for examination of candidates and awarding of promotions within its USJF authorized promotional authority. The USJF has established the following **GUIDELINES** for Yudanshakais in the evaluation and review of promotion applications.

Each Yudanshakai shall hold at least two promotional evaluation examinations each year. To accomplish this, each member Yudanshakai shall create a Yudanshakai Board of Examiners whose members shall be the higher-ranking members in the Yudanshakai. When a Yudanshakai's Board of Examiners consists entirely of examiners below the rank of Yodan (4th Degree Black belt), each examiner shall vote on candidates by casting votes equal to his or her rank: e.g. a Shodan would cast one vote, a Sandan would cast three votes, etc. Otherwise, all examiners shall have an equal vote.

The Yudanshakai Board of Examiners shall review the promotion application of each member, according to specific criteria for rank being considered. A Yudanshakai may adopt or modify the following USJF Guidelines for promotion within each Yudanshakai's promotional authority, **but such standard must be followed for promotion to rank beyond such authority**. Any Yudanshakai that has Promotion Authority for Godan must maintain a 300 <u>member</u> minimum to retain its Godan Rank Promotion Authority.

Promotion applications that are <u>beyond</u> promotion authority of the Yudanshakai shall be submitted for review by the USJF National Promotional Committee.

Yudanshakai Rank Promotional Authority Criteria for Godan

A Yudanshakai requesting Godan rank authority from the USJF Board of Examiners or maintaining their current Godan rank authority must meet the following requirements in order to obtain or retain their Godan rank authority.

Requesting Godan Rank Authority

A written request from the Yudanshakai President is required for Godan rank authority to be authorized. The request must be made to the USJF Board of Examiners for review and approval. The written request must include the following information:

- The Yudanshakai must be established, registered and active continuously for at least 5 years with USJF
- The Yudanshakai must have Yodan rank authority granted by USJF Board of Examiners

- A minimum of three or more Kodansha of Rokudan or higher awarded by USJF must be on the Yudanshakai's promotional committee that registered as active members with the USJF.
- A list is provided of the Promotional Committee Members' names and their USJF rank.
- The Yudanshakai must have a minimum USJF membership of 300 active members or higher continuously for at least four years in the prior to year they are applying for Godan rank authority

Maintaining Godan Rank Authority

- The Yudanshakai must maintain a minimum of 300 active USJF registered members AND a minimum of three or more Kodansha of Rokudan or higher awarded by USJF on the Yudanshakai's promotion committee who are registered active USJF members.
- The USJF Board of Examiners will institute a Godan rank authority probation for twenty-four months when the Yudanshakai fails to meet the following requirements:
 - Fails to maintain the <u>300 minimum</u> active USJF registered members <u>and/or</u>
 - Fails to have the minimum of three or more Kodansha of Rokudan or higher as awarded by USJF on their promotion committee who are registered active members with the USJF
- The Yudanshakai must bring any deficiency up to the minimum standard level required for the Godan rank authority. If unable to do so, the Godan rank authority granted by the USJF Board of Examiners will be rescinded. Further review and action will be taken by the USJF Board of Examiners to determine what rank authority will be granted to the Yudanshakai when the Godan rank authority is rescinded.
 - The Yudanshakai must provide written proof on the following to the USJF Board of Examiners at the end of their probationary period:
 - The number of active USJF registered members for the first 12 months of probation, the second 12 months of probation, and the current year.
 - The list of Kodansha names with rank awarded by the USJF on their Promotional Committee.
 - During the twenty-four month probationary period, the Yudanshakai will continue to have Godan rank promotion authority until the end of the probationary period.
 - If all deficiencies are corrected at the end of the probationary period, the Yudanshakai will retain their Godan rank promotion authority.
 - If any deficiencies ARE NOT corrected, based on the information provided by the Yudanshakai and the USJF National Office, the USJF Board of Examiners will rescind the Yudanshakai's Godan rank promotion authority and further decide whether to grant Yodan rank authority or lower rank authority to the Yudanshakai.

 A specific written notice revoking Godan rank authority must be sent from the Chair of the USJF BOE to the Chair of the Yudanshakai's BOE and the President of the Yudanshakai.

I. GENERAL PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

There are general requirements for promotion that must be satisfied as a precondition for promotion, regardless of the rank in question. Current membership with the USJF is required for all USJF promotions. Testing and evaluation may be conducted by a combination of oral, demonstrative, and/or written examinations.

Eligibility for promotion shall be based upon the following general requirements, not necessarily in this order:

- a. Moral character, attitude, and maturity
- b. Competitive ability
- c. Technical proficiency
- d. General experience, contributions, and time in grade
- e. Recommendation by the candidate's instructor

Time in Grade

Time in grade is that time spent at the applicant's present rank and is not cumulative from the date of any previous promotions. Time in grade is computed from the time the candidate's present rank was registered with the National Office and is determined solely by the number of years of USJF annual registration since the last promotion.

Promotion Points

Promotion Points may be counted only for the period of time from candidate's last promotion. Points may be credited only for wins against opponents that are no more than two ranks below and up to three ranks higher, and must be obtained in either USJF, USJA or USA Judo "sanctioned" events or other events as specified by the Yudanshakai Board of Examiners or the USJF Board of Examiners. An opponent may count only once in the tabulation of tournament points for each promotion. Promotion evaluation contests may be held for the purpose of substantiating the candidate's competitive abilities.

Shiai Promotion Points are typically earned by wins over opponents of equal rank, in qualified tournaments. An Ippon win over an opponent of equal rank is one (1) point, while a Waza-ari win over an opponent of equal rank is one-half (1/2) point. A Yudanshakai may also elect to award promotion points to candidates defeating opponents of higher or lower rank. A recommended guideline is as follows:

Batsu-gun Promotions

Yudanshakais may develop their requirements for Batsu-gun promotions in a single promotional tournament. To be recommended for Batsu-gun promotion within single promotional tournaments the competitor must have four (4) consecutive Ippon wins over opponents of same rank for promotions up to Ikkyu or Five (5) consecutive Ippon wins over opponents of same rank for Dan promotions. If a contestant beats an opponent of higher rank, the win must be by Ippon to qualify for Batsu-gun promotion; otherwise it is counted as a normal promotion point.

Competitors in the USJF /USJA Summer National Championships shiai competition of brown belt rank or higher may be promoted by Batsu- gun to the rank of Shodan with no kata requirement needing to be met.

USJF National Competition Shodan Batsu-gun Rank Criteria:

To be eligible for USJF National Competition Shodan Batsu-gun Rank, the candidate must satisfy the following criteria:

- 1. Enter the USJF/USJA Summer National Championships in the shiai competition as a registered member of USJF; and
- 2. Hold any current brown belt rank (proof of rank will be required for this purpose); and
- 3. Be at least 14 years old as of the competition date; and
- 4. In any one individual competitive division, achieve one of the following records:
 - a. Defeat no less than three (3) opponents each holding a current brown belt rank or higher with at least one win by Ippon; <u>or</u>
 - b. Defeat no less than five (5) opponents of any rank by Ippon; or
 - c. In any two (2) or more individual divisions at the same event, defeat five (5) or more opponents by
 - Ippon, at least three (3) of whom hold brown belt rank or higher; and
- 5. Have the consent and approval of the youth's Dojo Head Instructor <u>and</u> the youth's Yudanshakai's Board of Examiners Chairperson <u>or</u> the USJF Promotion Committee Chairperson approval must be obtained.

It is <u>recommended</u> that all Shodan candidates, except those promoted by Batsu-gun, take the USJF Teacher/Assistant Teachers or Coaching Certification.

Dan Rank awarded by other Judo organizations for application for a USJF Promotion

The candidate will only need to pay for their Yudanshakai and USJF promotion fees when the Dan rank can be verified by the candidate's ranking organization. Should the candidate's certification or organization not be able to be verified, the candidate will be required to pay all Yudanshakai and USJF promotion fees from Shodan through the rank the candidate is applying for.

Candidate Classification

To properly evaluate candidates for promotion, two classifications of judoka have been established:

Competitors:

A Competitor may have less time in grade and will be given greater weight for his or her competitive accomplishments towards promotional consideration. Shiai and Kata competitors can claim up to 20% off for being a contributor to USJF, by either being a National Officer (10%), Yudanshakai officer (10%), National Committee Chair (5%), or National Committee Member (3%). The reason for this is to give credit to those who volunteer their time and effort to help grow the USJF. If they are a USJF Life Member or USJF President's Club Life Member, the reduction is 5% to 10%. A Competitor candidate in the "A", "B", "C", or "D" Competitor Classification may claim any of these reductions.

Shiai Promotion Points Awarded According to Opponent Rank and Type of Win

Non-competitors:

A Non-competitor is an active member, who participates and contributes at all levels of the sport except competition. Non-competitors may be examined and promoted in the same basic manner as competitors with the exception that requirements shall be stricter, including longer time in grade. A Non-competitor may change his classification to that of a "Competitor" provided he or she passes all other requirements outlined for "Competitor". A major promotion criterion for Non-competitors is service to the USJF. Contributions by Non-competitors can be made at several different levels, including dojo, Yudanshakai, national, or international levels. Major contribution in these areas for the USJF can be considered to offset required Time in Grade.

CLASSIFICATIONS FOR COMPETITORS

In the following table, minimum Time in Grade (TIG) for a candidate is determined by the highest classification earned by that candidate at any point in time in their life.

Current Minimum Time in Grade and Age

- A. USA Shiai Team member or qualifier of the Olympic or Paralympic Games. Shiai competitor places 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the IJF World Championships, World Masters, Grand Slam, Grand Prix, or Class A+ or "A" international tournament. A kata competitor placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd at IJF World Kata Championships.
- B. USA Shiai Team member of the World Championship, Pan-American Games or the Continental Championship. Shiai competitor placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in a Continental Open or Class B international tournament. USA kata team member at IJF World Championship.
- C. Shiai competitor placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in regional black belt divisions. Placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the President's Cup, National Collegiate, Youth and Scholastic Nationals, US Senior Nationals, USJF/USJA Summer and Winter Nationals, or any non-point qualifying international competition. World Veterans (may depend on size of the division). USA Kata placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd at Continental Championships.
- D. Competes in Shiai (see table) in any sanctioned tournament and earns points based on performance, according to the number of wins and rank of opponents, which includes Veteran's competition at local, regional, state, national and international competition. For Kata competitors (see table below).

Kata D level Classification

For those placing in more than one Kata, take 3 months off TIG for each kata placing. To claim "D" level Kata classification in Local, Regional or National competitions, competitors must have been able to claim their placing in five kata divisions during their TIG for promotion. This applies to those candidates who are Nidan and above. The following would apply when claiming the classification: if there are three in a division 1^{st} place can claim "D" level; if four in a division $1^{st} \& 2^{nd}$ can claim "D"; if five or more 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , $\& 3^{rd}$ can claim "D" level classification.

National level includes: Senior Nationals, National Collegiate, USJA/USJF Junior Nationals, and USJA/USJF Winter Nationals. Competitors must place in at least one of these events to qualify at the National level.

TIG for a candidate is determined by their highest classification earned by that the candidate at any point in time in their life.

LIMITATIONS FOR REDUCTIONS IN TIME IN GRADE FOR CONTRIBUTION

Time in Grade is referred to as TIG on the Form 20. The TIG is the period of time from when the current rank of the applicant was registered with the USJF National Office to the date of the application for promotion. When completing the Form 20, TIG reductions are only applicable for the time concurrent with the current rank. Prior reductions cannot be counted. Only applicable current reductions can be counted when tabulating the TIG on the Form 20. Non Competitors may only claim a maximum of 30 % reduction in TIG (Competitors limit is 20%).

Senior Promotional Guidelines

The rank requirements specified below serve as guidelines for the requirements for promotion. Rank conversions from junior to senior may occur as outlined on page one of the Handbook. Yudanshakais may modify specific rank requirements for each rank, depending on circumstances, for ranks within each Yudanshakai's promotion authority, but these requirements are mandatory for all other promotions.

- **Rokkyu** General Requirements: This rank is assigned to individuals of good moral character who have been accepted as students of Judo in a Judo club or class.
- Gokyu Minimal Age: None Minimal Time in grade: 12 classes or 1 month General Requirements: Judo etiquette, basic judo hygiene, the correct forms of sitting, kneeling and standing. - Minimal Time in grade: Candidates for Judan shall have held USJF rank of Kudan for no less than 10 years. There shall be <u>no</u> Judan promotion awarded to any candidate <u>not</u> holding USJF Kudan rank.
- <u>When Judan Nomination may be considered</u>: Candidates for Kudan may be considered by the Promotional Committee and Board of Examiners only at the annual (Spring) corporate meeting in even numbered years (i.e. 2022, 2024, etc.)
- <u>Approval or Tabling</u>: A vote of 100% of both the Promotional Committee and the Board of Examiners shall be required for approval of Judan rank. No Judan application can be rejected. Any Judan promotion not approved must be tabled. Tabled Judan applications may be taken from the table for reconsideration at the later scheduled meetings according to the timing limitation set forth here in above; or may be withdrawn at any time by the Yudanshakai responsible for its original submission.
- <u>Lifelong USJF Yudanshakai Loyalty:</u> Absence of consistent lifelong loyalty can be considered one reason for tabling a candidate for Judan.
- <u>General Requirements:</u> Criteria include multiple factors including e.g. highest level of lifetime achievements in judo, leadership achievements in judo, leadership contributions at all levels of USJF judo, long record of the highest level of competition, coaching, officiating successes, unimpeachable character. Major contributions in multiple areas of judo development, promotion, support, published Judo works, etc. First Aid, CPR, Safe Sport and CDC Heads Up Certification. The USJF Promotional Committee makes the recommendation to the Board of Examiners.
- Significant lifetime achievements in Judo must be indicated in an attachment to the Form 20 prepared either by the candidate or by the nominating Yudanshakai.

DOJO SHODAN PROMOTIONAL PROCEDURES

The Yudanshakai and club must meet the following criteria:

Any USJF registered club can petition for a **Shodan** promotion in their club to their Yudanshakai. <u>Must meet all Yudanshakai requirements for Shodan promotion.</u>

- A. Candidate must fill out a form 20, obtain the following certifications: SafeSport, CDC Heads Up, and a background check (if a candidate is a minor, SafeSport and background check are not required). If non- competitor, a USJF Coaching or Teachers Certification is needed. A written essay from the candidate covering the following: why the candidate thinks they should be promoted to Shodan: what service they can provide to Judo and qualities it takes to be a Shodan. The essay will be sent to the Yudanshakai Chair of the Board of Examiners
- B. Examination will be conducted by three (3) USJF Sandans or higher.
- C. If the candidate passed the test, the score sheets will be sent to the Yudanshakai Chair of the BOE. The Yudanshakai Chair of the BOE will then send out an email vote to either pass or reject. If the candidate passes the vote of the Yudanshakai BOE, the Yudanshakai Chair of the BOE inform the candidate of his/her approved promotion. The candidate will then send all the required paperwork and fees to the appropriate Yudanshakai official. That official will then submit the signed Promotional Form 20 and all other paperwork and fees to the USJF National Office. The Yudanshakai official or candidate will submit Yudanshakai fees for promotion to the Yudanshakai Treasurer.
- D. If the next Yudanshakai BOE meeting is less than a month away, they can have the vote then.

Regulation for Honorary and Posthumous Promotion

- Honorary promotion to Shodan has a past precedent in USJF. This will be the only honorary promotion considered for a living person.
- All posthumous promotions must reflect the rank integrity of the USJF
- Regardless of the rank considered posthumous promotion can only be for honorary rank
- A completed promotion application must be submitted to the Promotion Committee for review at the subsequent semi-annual meeting to the applicant's passing. Should an individual pass away within 30 days of the semi-annual meeting, the application may be submitted at the next semi-annual meeting. Applications submitted after that time will not be considered. Only one application for posthumous promotion may be submitted.

• Should a promotion application be submitted to the Promotional Committee as per standard promotion regulations, and the candidate passes after that submission but before the semi-annual meeting, that application will be considered for a full promotion rather than an honorary one.

Promotional Application Process

- 1. **USJF Membership**: In order for the USJF to process a promotion the candidate must be a current paid up primary or secondary member of the USJF at the time of the application.
 - a. A Shodan applicant must show current membership plus <u>one year</u> prior membership.
 - b. For Nidan and above they must have current membership plus three years prior membership.
 - c. If the applicant does not have the required membership history, the history may be purchased for \$25.00 per year.
 - d. For applicants who are life members of the USJF then there is a flat fee of \$15.00 whether they need one or three years."
- 2. **Background Check**: All applicants for Shodan and above must undergo the USJF background/screening program per USJF documented procedure. (If candidate is a minor this is not needed.) Failure to complete this process will terminate the applicant's promotion process.
 - a. Please use latest USJF Form 590 available from the USJF website.
 - b. Proof of Background Screening provided through other judo national bodies is acceptable, so long as it is current and with at least one year before expiration.
 Proof must be included with the application.
- 3. Dan rank awarded by other Judo organizations: Dan rank is recognized if issued by legitimate national federations of Judo. Assuming that the rank can be verified, the rank can be used to earn their next rank through the normal rank promotion process for the Yudanshakai.
- 4. **Application Process**: For all Dan promotions, all applications need to meet the following criteria:
 - a. All Form 20s need to be submitted TYPED (filled in PDF format) with sections 1 through 8 completed in full. Those applying under *Competitor* status must also complete section 10, either the Shiai portion or the Kata portion or both portions. The mandatory Yudanshakai endorsement is section 9. Be specific and informative. *All Yudanshakai promotions* must be paid for before the National Office will review them. Should any deficiencies, including payment, not be rectified within six (6) months, the Form 20 will be placed in the "dead

file". Unanswered categories on Form 20 will also result in the application going into the "dead file". A letter will be mailed to the Yudanshakai letting them know the application has been placed in the "dead file". If the promotion fee has been paid, the Yudanshakai has six (6) months from the date of the "dead file" notification to request, in writing, that the promotion fee be returned, or they forfeit the entire promotion fee with no exceptions. Should the Yudanshakai want the promotion packet returned, that request must be made in writing with the same time constraint.

- b. The applicant and other responsible persons involved in completing Form 20 should never assume that the Board of Examiners or Promotion Committee will supply missing information.
- c. Any Yudanshakai's promotion under their authority is a matter as standard procedure, unless otherwise specifically defined. When any deficiencies are identified by the National Office, including payment, the Form 20 will go into the "dead file" should the Yudanshakai not respond to and rectify the deficiencies within six (6) months.
- d. Should an applicant whose Form 20 has been placed in the "dead file" desire a promotion at any time in the future, that applicant will have to restart the entire process from the beginning. There will also be a \$50 Administration fee assessed in addition to the regular promotion fee. The Administration fee will be divided evenly between the National Office and the applicant's Yudanshakai.
- e. For National Promotion Committee candidates (all Dan promotion applications above the rank authority of the Yudanshakai) the Yudanshakai must mail the Form 20 to the National Office at least 45 days prior to the announced USJF Promotion Committee Meeting together with the correct USJF Dan fee and a copy of the candidate's current Dan certificate to be considered at the meeting. The National office will notify the Yudanshakai official if there is incorrect or missing information on their candidate's paperwork. The candidate has two (2) weeks (from the 45-day deadline date) to rectify any incorrect or missing information, including payment. If the information and/or payment is not completed by that point, that promotion application will not be on the promotion roster for the National Promotion Committee meeting and will have to wait until the next Promotional meeting. The application can only be resubmitted if the entire Form 20 and payment are correct before the 45-day deadline for submission for the next USJF Promotion Committee meeting. A \$50 Administrative fee will be assessed to the candidate as well. This fee will be evenly split between the National Office and the first presenting Yudanshakai.

- 5. Applications for Godan and higher rank that are rejected cannot be resubmitted for at least two years.
 - a. Applications for Yodan and lower rank that are rejected cannot be resubmitted for at least one year. <u>CLARIFICATION</u>: An application which has been "tabled" upon due consideration or that has been "withdrawn" by the Yudanshakai shall not be treated as a "rejected" application.
 - b. Individuals currently holding USJF Teachers' Certification in a specific kata shall be exempt from any future kata examination of the specific kata required for promotion while maintaining such certification.
 - c. A tabled application submitted will be in our packet of candidates for our next meeting. A withdrawn application by the Yudanshakai or by the candidate will have to be resubmitted when they want to submit their promotion again to the committee.
 - d. The applications together with the correct USJF Dan fee and the required supporting documentation should be sent to the USJF National Office.
 - e. A Yudanshakai shall be entitled to be represented before the USJF Promotion Committee when its member is being considered for promotion by the USJF Promotion Committee. The representative shall act only for the purpose of introducing the candidate and providing background information relevant to the applicable rank standards.
 - f. The Promotion Committee will not take any Promotion application off the floor at the meeting.

- 7. Changes to promotion requirements and rules will become effective 90 days after approval by the Board of Examiners as a matter of standard procedure unless otherwise specified.
